

Stack N Wack

For this demonstration I am using 5 layers of 5" squares but any size will work. The number of squares is only limited by the number of layers that your roller blade will accurately cut at one time. The number of segments is determined by the number of layers. The cuts can be gently curved or straight. I prefer straight because they are faster to sew together.

1. Lining up the edges, stack the 5 layers.
2. Make a paper pattern to determine where you want the cut lines and number the segments. The first numbers (yellow) is the cutting and shuffling order. The second number (blue) is the sewing.
3. Cut (Wack) through the stack according to your pattern in the order of your first (yellow) numbers.
4. To shuffle (stack) your segments (using yellow numbers)
 - A. Take the top layer from #1 and place it on the bottom of that segment
 - B. Move the top 2 segments from #2 to the bottom of that segment
 - C. Move the top 3 segments from #3 to the bottom of that segment.
 - D. Continue shuffling until you get to the last segment. The last segment will not be shuffled.
5. Sew the segments together according to the second (blue) numbers, Lining-up the edge where the next segment connects.
6. Your block is ready to trim.
